


- Eco => Green Deal

- Participative => Aarhus Convention


"No one left behind"



The EPSR poverty target: reduce the number of people at risk of poverty or social exclusion by at least 15 million by 2030

• The poor cannot afford climate investments nor price increases

Energy and mobility poverty

 Funding the investments to achieve the objectives of the Green Deal might compromise the social objectives

Climate policies might increase poverty & social inclusion

Towards a socio-ecological welfare state

- -Instruments that jointly serve environmental and social objectives (e.g. social housing, public transport)
- -Social environmental policy (e.g. Social Investment Fund)
- -Ecological social policy (e.g. greening the social infrastructure)
- -Strengthening social security and social investment
- -Broadening the financial base
- -Strengthening protection mechanisms in case of calamities
- -Strengthening participation

Which roles for Europe?

• **Guarantor**: strenghtening social rights (e.g. a Directive on minimum incomes)

• **Guide**: strenghtening the social monitoring of ecological policies & the ecological monitoring of social policies

• **Supporter**: making the distribution of funds more conditional on ecological and social criteria

These roles could be strengthened at EU!

Include environmental objectives/policies in social monitoring (e.g. indicators on energy poverty or measuring the impact of climate policies on poverty and social exclusion)

Include social objectives/policies in the climate assessment

→ Just transition mainstreamed in NECP

Include climate objectives in the distribution of social funds.

Strengthen the focus on Just transition in.. The « territorial just transition plans ».

Strengthen participation, especially and urgently in terms of the interpretation of the use of the Social Climate Fund.
